- York students are required to complete (pass) three (3) Writing intensive (WI) courses: two (2) in the lower division (100-200 level) and one (1) in the upper division (300-level).
- If you transferred to York College with credit for General Education requirements, you must still complete one (1) WI course in the upper division within your major. If your major has no upper division WI course, you must take a WI course chosen in consultation with your major advisor.
- B.A. students must complete 90 credits of liberal arts See Bulletin.

^Students are <u>strongly recommended</u> to take these Pathways courses, as they provide the academic content needed for Elementary teachers who must prepare lessons linked the Common Core standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Creative Arts, as well as <u>pass the Content Specialty Test (CST) in multi-subjects</u>.

- *Students must choose a different subject area to fulfill Scientific World than was used to fulfill Life & Physical Sciences, and **must** have one lab.
- +Foreign Language courses are determined through placement by the Foreign Language Department, Room 3C08.
