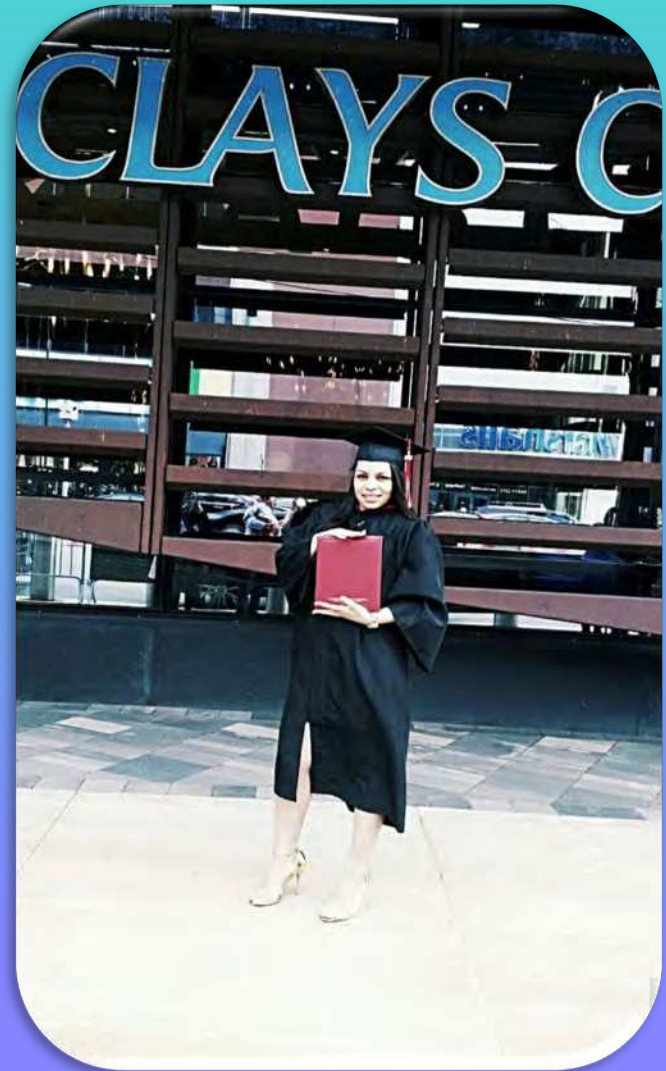

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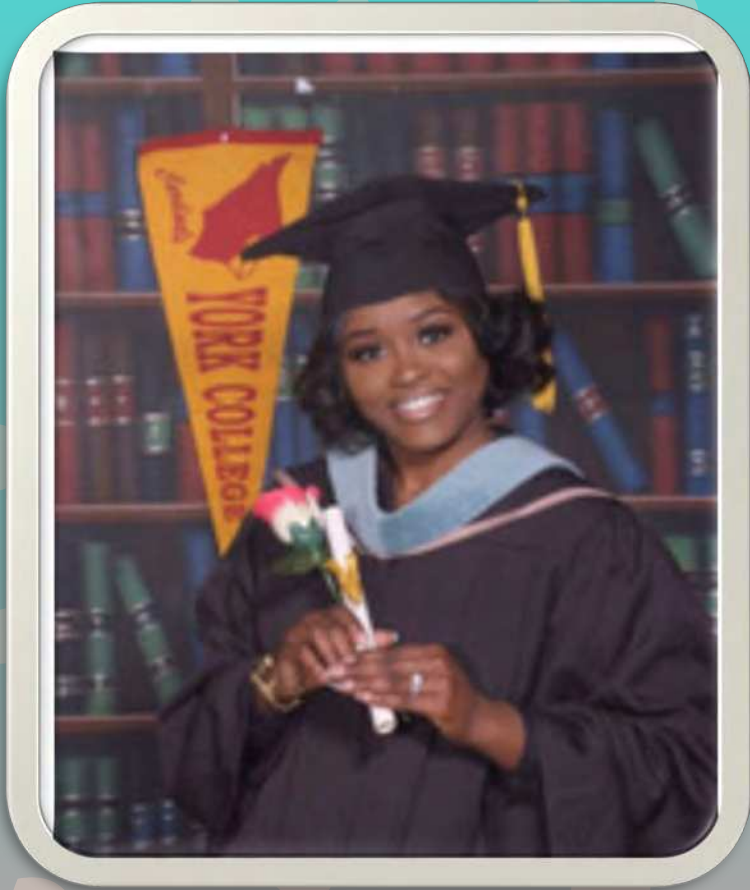

The education program helped me become a confident and prepare teacher. Professor Misir inspired me to continue my journey as a teacher by sharing her story of how she decided to continue her education.



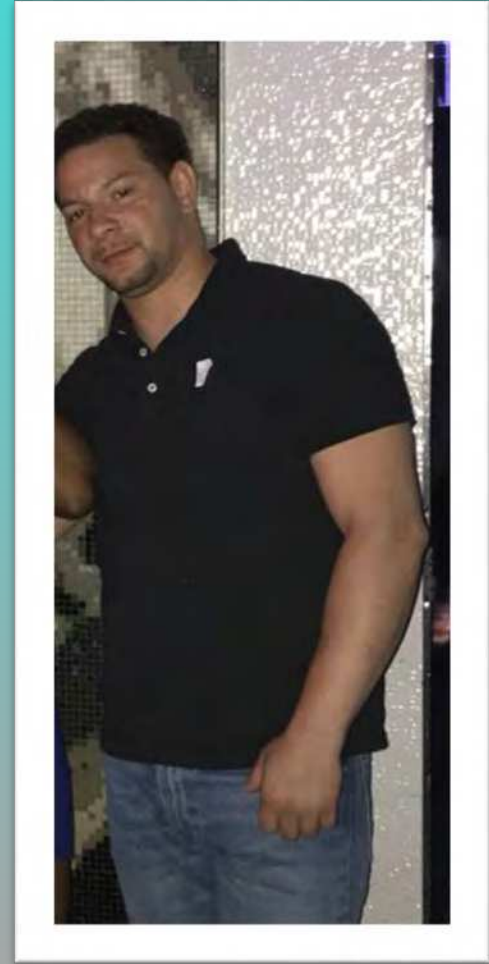

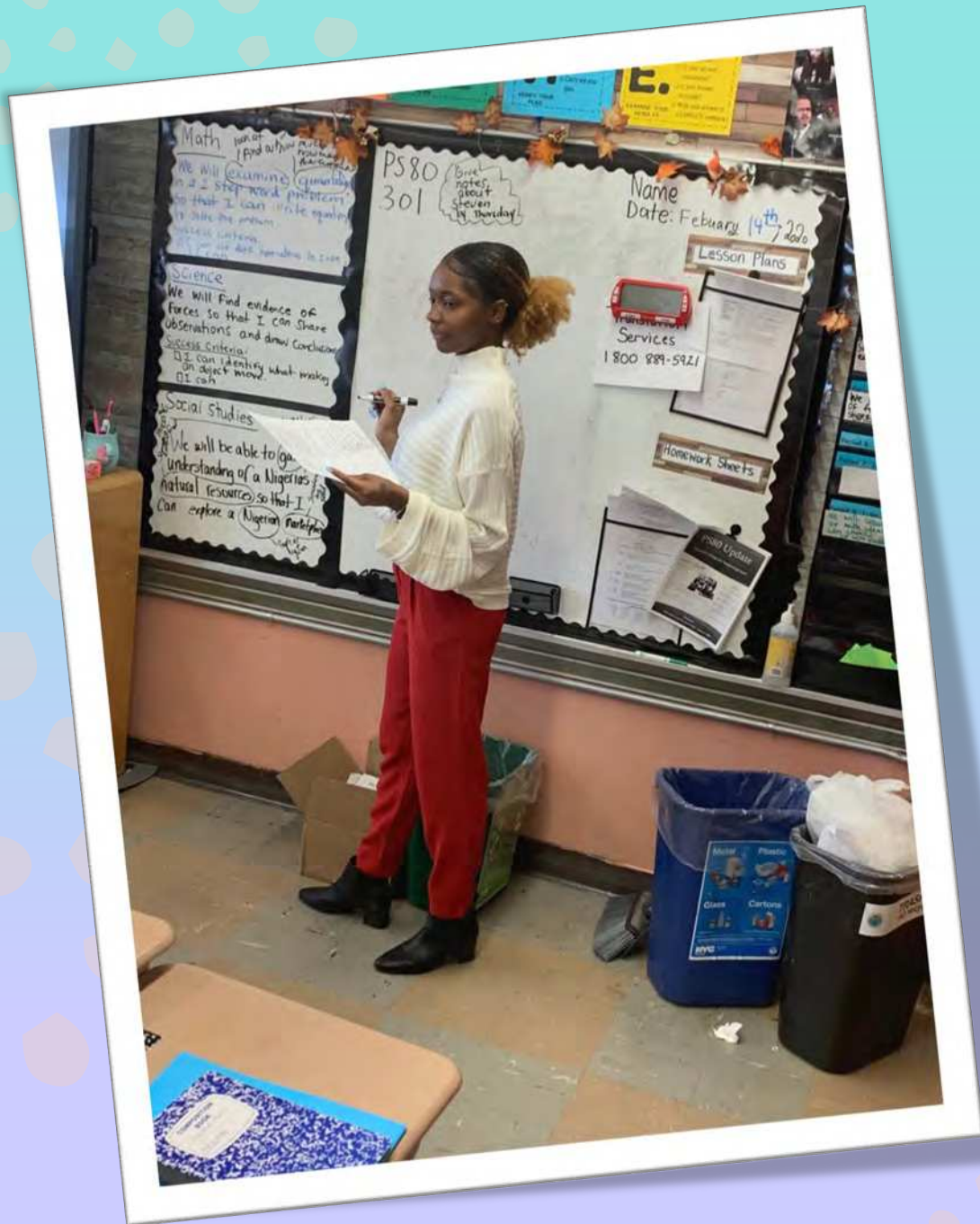
