#### NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

1943 was an important year for Jean Paul Sartre. His main treatise Being and Nothingness was published and his drama The Flies triumphed at the Theatre de la Cite in Paris. Then, that Autumn in two weeks, Sartre dashed off a short play called Huis Clos or Behind Closed Doors which was to become one of his most famous and most produced plays.

Some critics contend that the play reflected his current relationships with his protégée and sometime mistress Olga Kosakiewicsz (Estelle), his long time friend and constant companion Simone de Beauvoir (Inez) and himself (Garcin). The leading character of Estelle was written for Wanda who was studying to become an actress. Albert Camus was scheduled to play Garcin as well as direct the play. Unfortunately, Olga Barbezat (the actress playing Inez) was arrested by the Nazis and this production was scrapped. It was produced later by a professional company at the Theatre du Vieux Colombier. The short play was well - received and at the end of WWII it was translated and produced world wide now under the title *No Exit*.

Whether autobiographical or not, the play reflects Sartre's Existential Philosophy.

Estelle's lines: "When I can't see myself in the mirror, I can't even feel myself, and I begin to wonder if I really exist at all."

Or Inez: "You're yellow, Garcin yellow, because I want it.—I want you to be yellow---and yet look how weak I am! The only thing about me that exists is the fact that I'm looking at you, that I'm thinking about you."

And finally, Garcin's famous line: "Hell is other people"

The setting in Hell and the flamboyant characters who become irrevocably entwined have created a lasting audience for the play. It was for this reason and because one of my students said that reading the play changed his life, that I chose *No Exit* for the Spring Production at York. This production conceived by the set designer has become a creative product of the designers, the actors, student backstage workers and the director.

\*All SpeechComm/TA majors must take SPCH 101 as a Prereq for completion of the Major. Majors in Speech Communication/Theatre Arts must fulfill their General Education Requirements in a discipline other than their major.


# WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST...

Timothy J. Amrhein (Associate Professor of Theatre Design) holds an MFA from Wayne State University. He has designed sets and costumes for various productions throughout the United States. Some of his most recent productions include: Twelfth Night, The Merry Widow, the first New York City revival of The Full Monty, and The Fantasticks.
