Basic Paragraph Format

A *paragraph* develops a single idea in detail and advances your *argument* by providing support for your paper's *thesis*.

A paragraph consists of three basic parts:


- 1. Topic sentence

 States the main idea of the paragraph
- 2. Supporting details

 Elaborate upon the main idea
- 3. Concluding sentence

Ties together the ideas included in the paragraph, reiterates the main idea, and provides a transition to the next paragraph
